# **Presentation of 2026 Budgets**

13 Elections budget presented by Michael Brown. He explained that there will be four elections in

14 2026. Last year budget was \$5,997 and the proposed budget is \$9,673. There was a brief

discussion on the election software implemented in 2025. There was a discussion regarding the

efficiencies that the software brought. Harry Seidel stated he is disappointed that there is not a

reduction in wages with the efficiencies from the software. Alfred Hanson noted that one

election cost \$5,200 and four elections will cost \$9,700. There was a discussion regarding the

special town meeting coming up. Michele Courser stated the special town meeting is not

included in the budget. Mike Cutting questioned where the funding will come for the special

town meeting. Bill Hanson stated that the Select Board should cover the cost. Harry Seidel

asked if there is anywhere in the Elections budget that can be cut. Michele Courser stated that

23 there is nowhere to cut.

### Conservation Commission budget presented by Nancy Martin.

Last year budget was \$951 and only \$250 was spent. The proposed budget is \$753. Bill Hanson

asked if any of the Land Use Change Tax monies received would be returned to the Town. Nancy

Martin stated that it would not be legal. Alfred Hanson explained that would require a warrant

29 article. Bill Hanson asked if Nancy Martin would be opposed to that. Nancy Martin explained

that she would be opposed to that. Bill Hanson asked how the Land Use Change Tax is used.

Nancy Martin explained that they are working on three conservation projects. She stated that the

fund balance is \$130,000. Bill Hanson stated that he supports conservation efforts but he would

33 like to know what the appetite of the Town is given the increase in property values. Nancy

34 Martin spoke about the four family farms in Warner and the enhancement of agricultural

businesses in town. She explained that it more than just protecting land, it is also using the land

in a sustainable way that is good for everyone.

#### **Health and Welfare budget** presented by Elizabeth Labbe.

- 39 2025 budget was \$45,180, and the proposed budget is \$52,404. Elizabeth Labbe explained that
- 40 currently the Town is contracting with Carol Conforti-Adams.
- Wages: 10 hours or less per week at \$25.00 per hour. \$12,000
- Telephone: \$1.
- 43 Computers: \$1
- There was a discussion regarding the need for the town to find a trained individual to take over
- 45 the welfare responsibilities. Elizabeth Labbe spoke about the interested candidates.

- 1 Software: \$1
- 2 Membership: reduced to \$300
- 3 Mileage: no change at \$100
- 4 Direct Assistance: \$40,000
- 5 There was a discussion regarding the challenges related to welfare issues. Elizabeth Labbe stated
- 6 that there is a shortage in fuel, food and housing.7

#### 8 **Building Inspector budget** presented by Elizabeth Labbe

- 9 2025 budget \$\$26,510 and the proposed budget is \$30,600 an increase of 15.4%. Bill Hanson
- stated that some of the increase will be offset by building permit revenue.
- 11 Supplies/Postage: increased to \$1,500
- Wages: \$7,500 (\$5,500 building inspector and \$2,000 compliance officer)
- Mileage: \$2,400 (\$2,000 building inspector and \$400 compliance officer)

#### 15 Town Hall building

- 16 Custodian wages decreased to \$2,000
- 17 Electricity: decreased to \$4,000
- 18 Heating fue: \$6,500
- 19 Water/Sewer: decreased to \$1,000
- 20 Fire Alarm: decreased to \$1,000
- 21 Supplies: decreased to \$800
- 22 Maintenance/Repairs: no change \$6,000
- 23 Mileage: \$100
- 24 Propane: no change \$910
- Equipment Inspections: no change \$3,000 26

#### 27 Warner Community Center

- 28 Electricity: \$6,100
- Heating fuel: decreased to \$8,000
- 30 Water/Sewer: \$900
- 31 Sprinkler/Fire Alarms: \$700
- 32 Supplies: \$1
- 33 Maintenance/Repairs: decreased to \$12,000
